

Jon Bauer

Jon Bauer is a Clinical Professor of Law at UConn Law School, where he directs the Asylum and Human Rights Clinic, a program in which law students represent persons fleeing persecution who are seeking asylum in the U.S. He also teaches courses and has published articles in the fields of anti-discrimination law, legal ethics, and refugee law. The Asylum and Human Rights Clinic includes a cross-disciplinary program involving students and faculty at the UConn Schools of Medicine and Social Work, and frequently works with health professionals as expert witnesses.

Professor Bauer's presentations on mental health issues in asylum cases and the role of experts include the keynote address at the 2006 annual meeting of the Connecticut Psychiatric Society and a 2017 workshop at the International Congress on Law and Mental Health in Prague. An article he co-authored, *Asylum Seekers in a Time of Record Forced Global Displacement: the Role of Physicians*, was recently published in the Journal of General Internal Medicine.

Professor Bauer is a Connecticut Bar Foundation James W. Cooper Fellow.
