

## **Sheila Hayre**

After graduating from the Yale Law School in 2002, Sheila Hayre clerked for the U.S. Court of Appeals for the Second Circuit and then the U.S. District Court for the District of Connecticut. For the next 10 years, she worked as a staff attorney at New Haven Legal Assistance Association, Inc., where she practiced both family law and immigration law, focusing on cases involving domestic violence and abuse. From 2013 until 2016, Sheila served on the faculty at the National University of Singapore's Faculty of Law. She taught Trial Advocacy, Legal Case Studies, "Crossing Borders: Law, Migration and Citizenship," and a clinical course called the "Employment Law and Migrant Workers' Clinic."

Sheila joined the faculty at the Quinnipiac University School of Law in the fall of 2016. This year, as a visiting associate professor, she supervises students in the Law School's Civil Justice Clinic and continues to teach classes on immigration and representing clients. She also serves on the Connecticut Grievance Panel for the New Britain and Hartford Judicial Districts. Sheila holds an A.B. in psychology and an A.M. in anthropology from Stanford University.
