Professor Kaas is the Director of Experiential Education and also serves as the Director of the Law School's Family Law Concentration program, and co-director of the Center on Dispute Resolution.

Professor Kaas taught for twenty years in the in-house Civil Clinic, supervising students who represented low-income clients in a variety of civil and family matters. She is currently teaching a wide range of field placement courses, with a companion seminar entitled "Examining the Practice of Law." She also teaches Negotiation and Mediation, and is the lead professor for the clinical pre-requisite course in interviewing, counseling, and negotiation, called "Introduction to Representing Clients."

Professor Kaas has served on several committees and boards, including the national Clinical Legal Education Association and the Connecticut Bar Association Standing Committee on Professionalism. She also serves on the Boards of Connecticut Council for Non-Adversarial Divorce, Connecticut Legal Services, and is a founding member of the Connecticut Mediation Association and The Non-Defensive Voice. She has written on legal education, clinical legal education, family law, and mediation.

Professor Kaas is a Connecticut Bar Foundation James W. Cooper Life Fellow.
