

Behavioral Health Medical Director, Northeast Region

Steven Korn, M.D.

Steven is the Medical Director for Behavioral Health for the Anthem Connecticut, Maine, New Hampshire and Empire Blue Cross and Blue Shield Plans. He provides clinical leadership for utilization management, case management and grievance and appeals of behavioral health services for members in New England and New York. He collaborates with the other Anthem Behavioral Health Medical Directors in developing policies and guidelines and making sure that Anthem is compliant with all regulatory requirements. Steven consults with other Anthem clinical and operations leaders where Behavioral Health matters intersect with other health care needs of our members.

Prior to his role at Anthem, Steven was in clinical practice as a Child and Adolescent Psychiatrist since 1986. In his clinical career, he provided direct care to children, adolescents and adults in psychiatric and medical hospital settings, residential treatment centers, and outpatient practice. He practiced in both the public and private sectors, mostly in group or team based practice settings. He was a Medical Director for a non-profit behavioral health agency serving children and adolescents and for two Adolescent Inpatient hospital programs. He got his start in managed health care leading a depression disease management project with primary care physicians. Steven next gained experience working for a Managed Behavioral Health company for a large urban Medicaid population.

In 2006 Steven joined Anthem in his current role as Northeast Medical Director. In the years since he started, the Behavioral Health membership of New Hampshire and New York (Empire) were brought 'in house' from carved out contracts.

Steven received his BA from Earlham College and his MD from Northwestern University. He completed a Residency in Psychiatry at Boston University Medical Center and a Child and Adolescent Psychiatry Fellowship at Tufts/New England Medical Center. He is Board Certified in both Psychiatry and Child and Adolescent Psychiatry. He is a Fellow of the American Psychiatric Association. He holds medical licenses in Arizona, California, Connecticut, Maine, New Hampshire, New York and Vermont.
